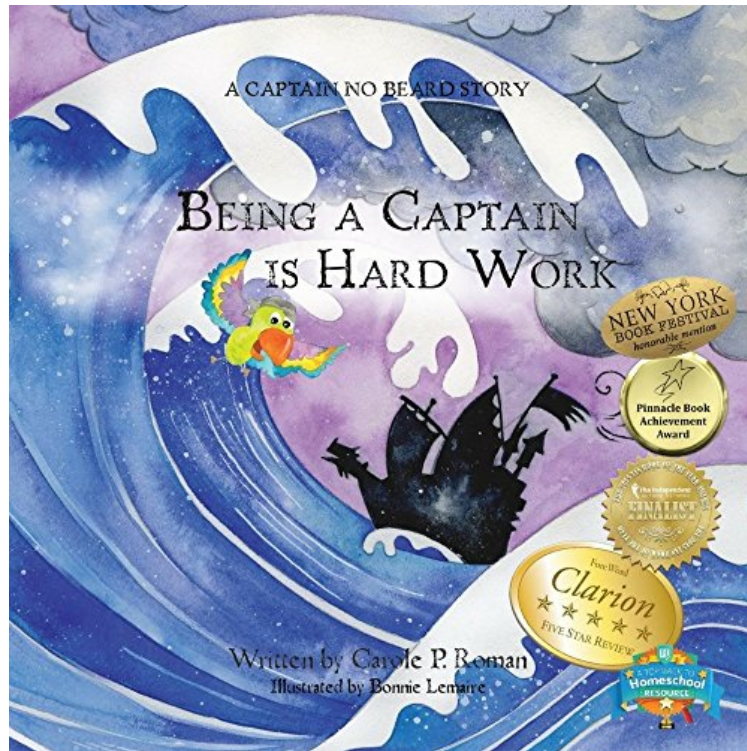

His position never changes in the face of mounting evidence, to the point where Zach is placed in grave danger. Demonstrating his courage, the captain rescues Zach and then is forced to a point of extreme humility where he must admit his mistakes. There are two lessons in this book, one major about life and the other a factual one involving science. When it is first clear that he has made a mistake, Captain No Beard refuses to admit it, making the consequences of his mistake far greater than they otherwise would be. This is a very important lesson about life, you will make mistakes, so the only reasonable course of action is to admit them early and learn from them. The second lesson is about the different types of clouds and what they mean. Mongo knows that a storm is coming because he recognizes the correct cloud type. The captain disagrees because he misidentifies the cloud type. There is a complete list of cloud types at the end with explanations of what they mean. If

done right, life lessons and science lessons can be effectively combined in an entertaining manner. This book is an existence proof of that.
