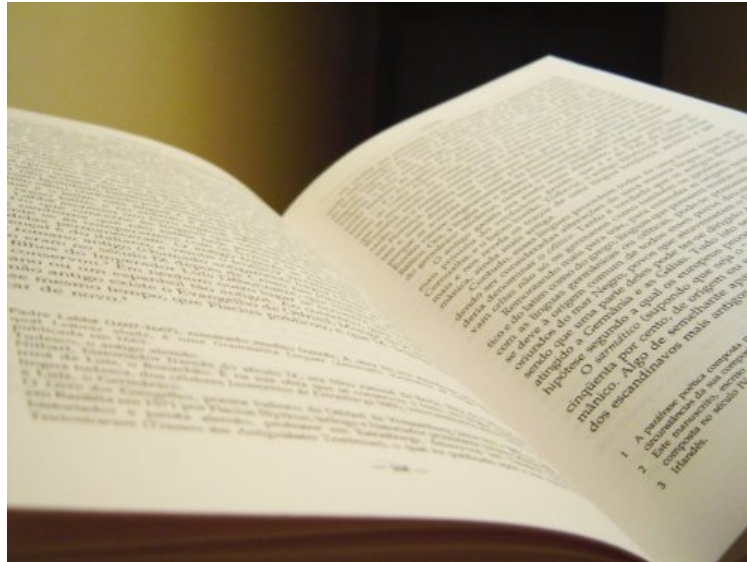

Lewis, William Barclay, Ron Mehl, Norman Vincent Peale and countless others.But I would not recommend this book to my friends or relatives.The descriptions of violence and torture were so graphic and disturbing that it took me some time to erase those horrific images from my thought.The wrongs committed against our martyred brothers and sisters in Christ should never be forgotten, but do we really need all the details of their unspeakably violent, painful and agonizingly slow deaths?I don't think so.These martyrs didn't die so that we could still be talking and reading about the specifics of their tortured deaths. They sacrificed their lives in the name of Christ.
