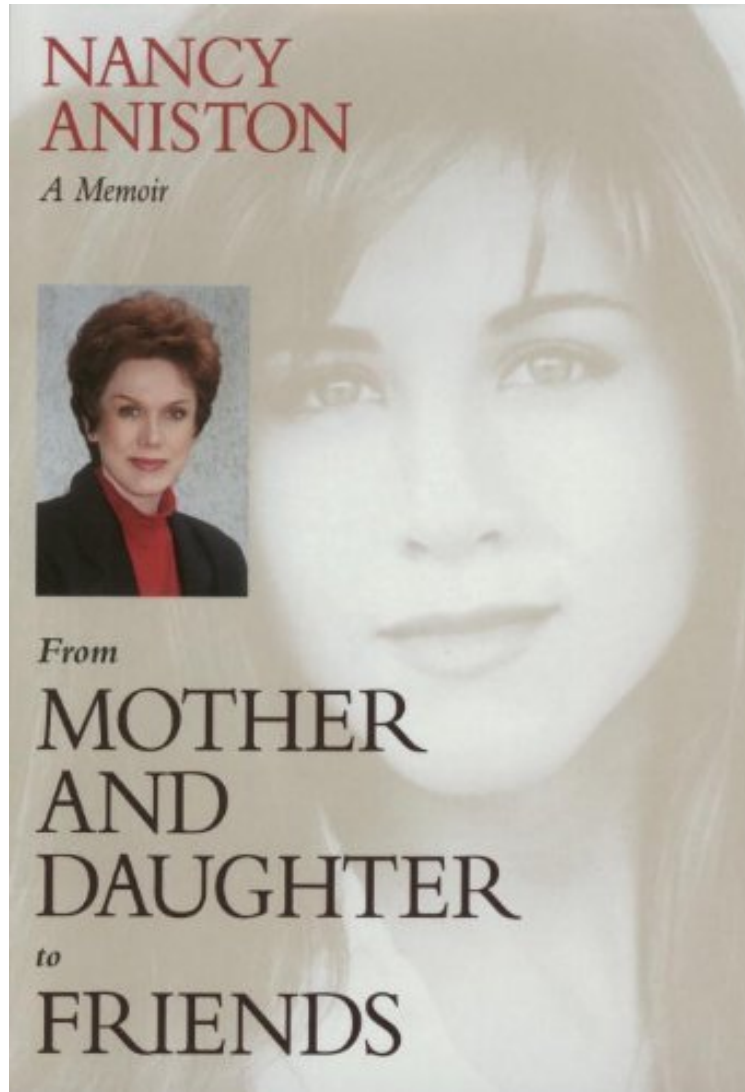

A mother opens up her guts and her heart and shares very private highs and lows in her life with us the reader. Her mamma bear protective attitude continues for her cubs. Nancy displays her compassion for others who are working their way through estrangements. The present day one with her daughter is clearly Jennifer's loss in not trying to better understand and accept that her mom obviously loves her unconditionally. The fact that she has become a celebrity must have only made the writing of this book more difficult but even though only a part of the book includes Jenny's 20some years we, the reader, get a glimpse into the amazing potentials that a child can have. The book is a great example of two things for us: (1) How we must learn to separate the person from the action, time and time again. (I feel more enabled to accept that I can not like the actions without it interfering with my love for the person.) and (2) We can use the tool of journaling and exploring the feelings as well as circumstances of our past to see how they often mold ways in which we handle our lives and relationships today. So again, I hope potential readers will ignore the sour grapes review. See that any claim of distortions in the book may well mean that the person(s) feel they were or actually were a part of the author's life and their viewpoint may well be from another angle. Naah. This is just an uninteresting story of the author's life of ups and downs, as if most of us don't go through the same things.
