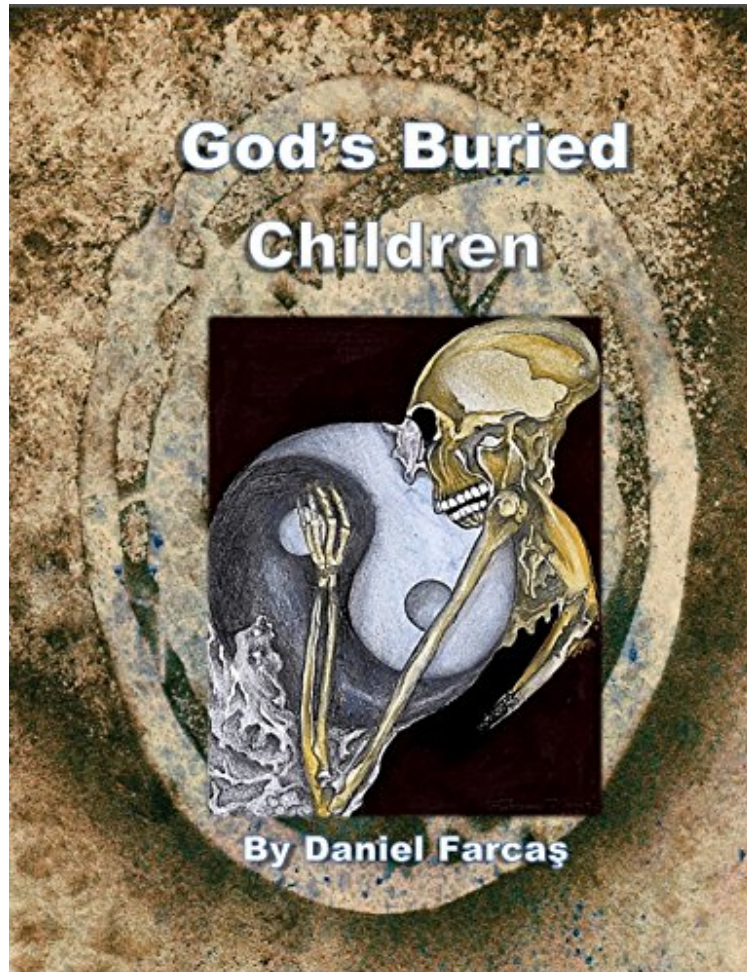

Brutal life story about growing up on the streets of communist RomaniaVon Helpful AdviceGod's Buried Children written by Daniel Farcas is a powerful and shocking story based on true events about the orphan Romanian child back in 1980s, during the time when Romania was still ruled by communists.Daniel Farcas used his journal for the purposes of writing this novel, though while reading it is hard to resist the impression that certain things are more or less altered to emphasize the brutality and cruelty of the world that the author described.The main novel protagonist is the author himself, young Daniel, who is struggling to survive the cruel state orphanage. After he escaped the unimaginable terror, Daniel is forced to beg or steal in order to survive. The only companions in his life are his friends, equally discarded and forgotten as Daniel is, that are far from company anyone would want for own child, but the only people

that Daniel has, his only family. Caught in the trap of politics, bare survival and social system that is falling apart around him, in Daniel's life due to the twist of fate new person will enter who together with his friend will change Daniels future and destiny. The story of Daniel Farcas shocks with its brutality, graphic violence and language, while author certainly succeeds to evoke the harsh conditions in which he lived as a child before, due to the twist of fate, managing to get his freedom and chance for normal life. The authors work is strong and will shake every reader because unlike the fiction, here in every moment the reader has to remember that the events shown within are (mostly) based on real events. What significantly reduced the reading experience are the problems with grammar and spelling, many of those that can be found within the book covers. Although it is understandable that the novel was written by a man whose native language is not English, my recommendation is to make the full book editing because this work due to its quality deserves it and certainly afterwards will attract an exceptional attention of the audience. Even it is not impossible to imagine the movie based on Farcas story given the audience as much shocked, however, likes to read /watch such stories. So if you want to read a brutal life story about growing up on the streets of communist Romania and are willing to have patience for grammatical and spelling problems, this is definitely a book that can be recommended, although be careful because the level of violence is really only for those with the strongest nerves. I was given a copy of this book by the author for the purpose of unbiased review, while all the presented information is based on my impressions.
