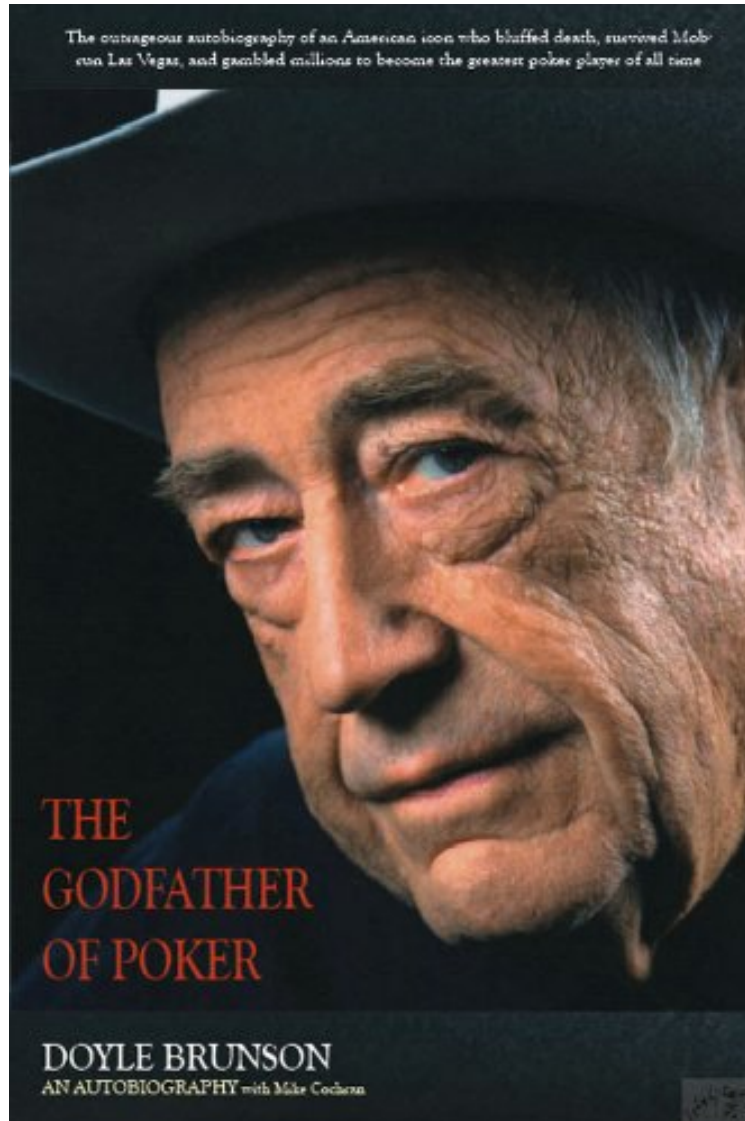

Anschaulich fhrt er den Leser durch sein schillerndes Leben - wie in Texas alles begann und ber die wilden Zeiten in Las Vegas, als Mafia und Mob die Spielerstadt prgten. Wichtig ist das Bewusstsein, dass es sich hier wirklich um eine Biographie handelt, es geht nicht ums Pokern als solches. Die Geschichte ist fesselnd mit

vielen Anekdoten (einige davon findet man im Film "Glück im Spiel" wieder, da war Doyle Brunson ja auch Berater). Die Sprache ist etwas anspruchsvoll mit einigen Ausdrücken, die nicht jedermann geläufig sind. Ein besseres Englisch sollte man schon haben, um das Buch genießen zu können. Einen Punkt Abzug gibt es, weil sich die Geschichte an einigen Stellen etwas in die Länge zieht. Auch wäre es interessant gewesen zu erfahren, wie er nach seinen diversen Verlusten der Bankrott jeweils wieder auf die Füße gefallen ist. Alles in allem aber ein sehr gutes und unterhaltendes Buch. Zuletzt noch ein Wort zur Form: Amerikanische Bücher sind immer wieder qualitativ zweifelhaft, was Form und Material anbelangt. Es gibt nur wenig neue Informationen und die Gliederung des gesamten Buches wirkt etwas wild. Als besonders frech empfinde ich dabei den eigenwilligen Zuschnitt der Seitenränder (das Muster strahlt beim Umblättern, habe ich in dieser Form noch NIE gesehen!) sowie die zahlreichen Freiseiten.
