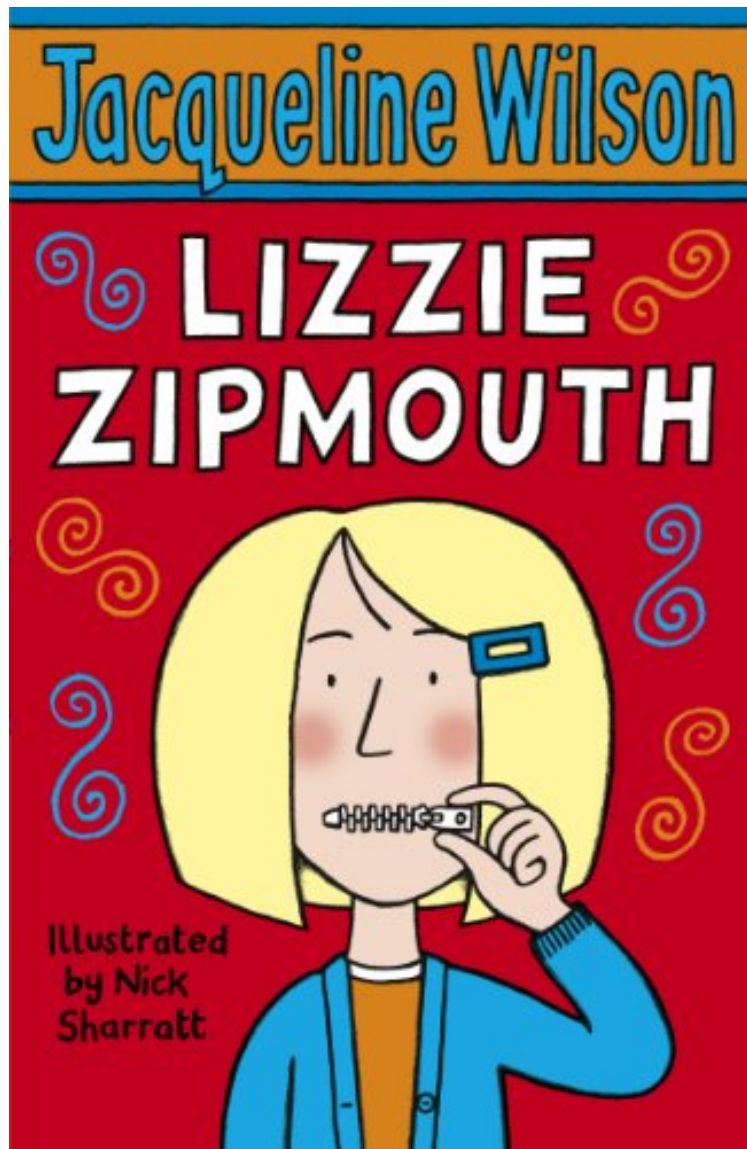

It started really promising when Lizzie had to move in with a father and his two sons because her mom fell in love and Lizzie stopped speaking because she didn't want a new family. However the story totally lacks of funny situations. I also found the part with the dolls and the tea-parties rather old-fashioned and boring. The setting is really great - patchwork family, caring for old people - and definitely has a lot to say for young readers. I would recommend it for 12 or 13 year-old non-native speakers and it's definitely only a book girls would like to read.
