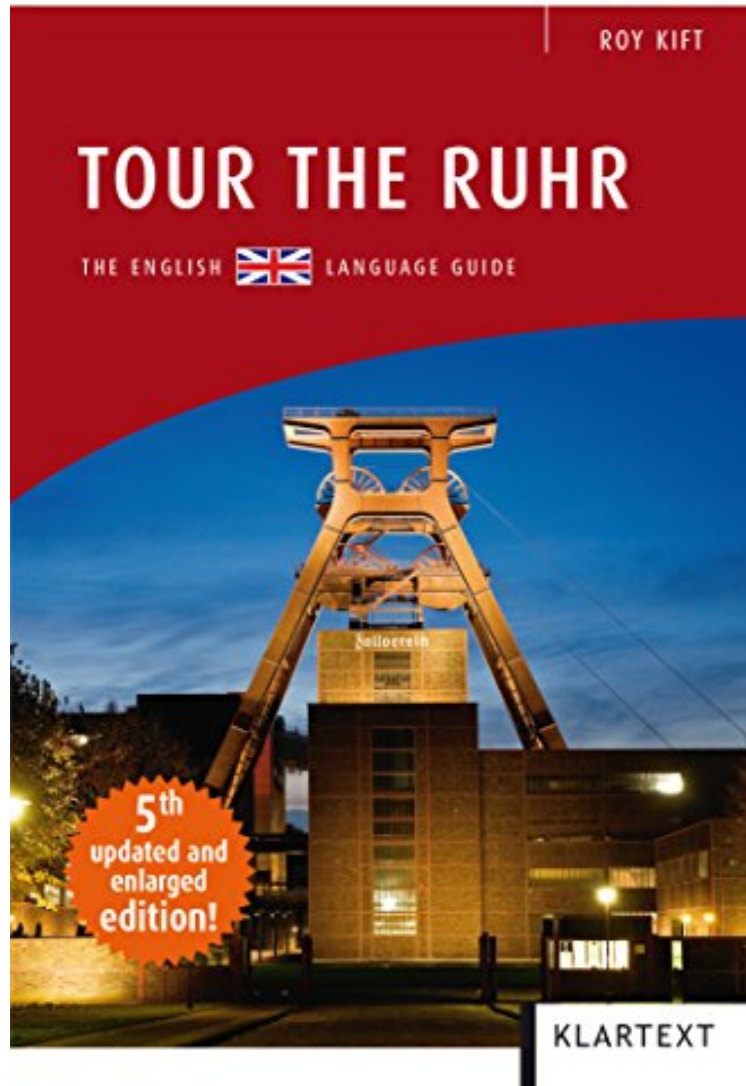

heavily industrialized and can be skipped". Little do they know! This book proves them to be utterly wrong and outdated. Heavy industry once formed this huge metropolitan area since the 1850s (although some cities date back as far as the 10th century), but coal mines and steel mills have practically disappeared since the 1980s. Since then, it successfully grappled with the huge structural change that this brought about and became one of the most interesting regions in Europe. And - you won't be run over by hords of tourists as in the traditional tourist hubs. Roy Kift collected tons of valuable information about the region, from museums, theaters, bars, to soccer clubs - some of that information is even little known by many inhabitants of it! If you stay in this region, this book is a must have! If you never even thought of going to this region, read the book and you may want to go there!

I have tested all the venues personally for general quality, English information and wheelchair access, and also indicate venues which are particularly attractive for families. Bars, discos, restaurants and cafs are included along with extensive information on all the sites along the Industrial Heritage Trail, museums, art galleries, theatres and opera house, parks and baths, Borussia Dortmund and Schalke 04. The book starts with a short history of the area. I provide a chapter telling you how to make the most of the public transport system and then give a list of my personal top twelve "hits" before covering the region town by town. Private and public transport directions are given to all venues, as are opening times, admission prices, phone, fax, email and website addresses.
